

## Appendix

### Glossary and methodology

#### (NEW) Overall IPR petition trends

A simplified analysis was performed for calculating overall IPR petition trends. With this analysis, as of September 30, 2024, the number of petitions filed against each patent is calculated regardless of who filed the petition. The petition filing date is used to determine which petitions to report in the overall trends for select periods. The classification of a petition (specifically, whether it is a solo petition or one of multiple petitions) is based on all petitions filed as of September 30, 2024.




### Glossary and methodology

**Petition**: *Inter partes* review (IPR) petitions challenging the validity of at least one of a patent's claims.

#### **Petition classifications**

- **Solo petition**: A petition filed challenging the patentability of at least one of a patent's claims if, as of September 30, 2024, no other petition had been filed challenging the patentability of any of the patent's claims.
- One of multiple petitions: A petition filed challenging the patentability of at least one of a patent's claims if, as of September 30, 2024, there are any previous or subsequent petitions filed challenging any of the patent's claims.
- **Initial or first petition**: The first petition filed as one of multiple petitions. Whether a petition was filed first depends on the filing date of the petition relative to the other petitions.
- Additional petition: The second, third, etc., petition filed as one of multiple petitions. Whether a
  petition was filed second, third, etc., depends on the filing date of the petition relative to the other
  petitions.

#### (NEW) Overall multiple petitions trends



The new metric introduced in this addendum captures the volume of petitions that represent additional petitions that a patent owner may need to respond to, along with the initial petition, against the same patent. For example, if a patent is challenged twice, then the initial petition and the additional petition would both be counted as one of multiple petitions. Until an additional petition is filed against the same patent, a petition is considered a **solo petition**.
